

Cache Mosquito Abatement District Board of Trustees

The Cache Mosquito Abatement District (CMAD) Board of Trustees met for a regular meeting on Tuesday, July 29, 2014, at 7:00 pm in the Bear River Health Department conference room 154 (1350 N 655 E, Logan). Representatives from 12 municipalities and the county unincorporated area were present:

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by chairman Elaine Nelson. The agenda was reviewed. Jeff Ricks moved, and Darwin Pitcher seconded, the agenda be adopted. Ayes: Wood, Godfrey, Pitcher, Jepsen, Price, Nelson, Johnson, Mather, Spackman, Ricks, and Tingey. Nays: none. Motion passed unanimously.

MINUTES

The minutes of the June 26, 2014 meeting were reviewed and discussed. Terrie pointed out that she had Scott Larsen recorded as voting before he'd arrived so the minutes will be amended.

Darwin Pitcher moved, and David Wood seconded, that the minutes be approved as corrected. Ayes: Wood, Pitcher, Rigby, Nelson, Ricks, and Tingey. Nays: none. Abstain: Jepsen, Price, Godfrey, Spackman, and Johnson. Motion passed unanimously.

Rigby, Smith, and Mather arrived.

MANAGERS REPORTS

Terrie reported that overall numbers of mosquitoes are down from last year at this time and distributed the count chart prepared by Richard. The pasture mosquito (*Ochlerotatus nigromacilis*) is present higher numbers than seen since 2005-2006. It likes to harbor and lay eggs in tall grass. Richard had one fogger adjusted to put out the same amount of chemical but at a different proportion to the diluent oil so as to make the fog 'heavier' to see if that would help control this mosquito. Several trustees expressed their appreciation for special event fogging done by the field crew.

The pickup finally arrived and Terrie and Richard took delivery on their way back from a procurement code/UMAA meeting in Moab. There's still no word from the state on the administrative rules for the new procurement code that we must comply with January 1, 2015. Terrie discussed the phone log. There was a bill in Congress to exempt mosquito abatement districts from the NPDES (National Pollution Discharge Elimination System) but it failed to pass. The state environmental quality department has still not sent the invoice for the UPDES which will be \$1,650. The district was contacted for comment on two press releases from Logan City; Terrie brought copies for the Board to read.

2ND QUARTER 2014 FINANCIAL REPORT

The financial report, including the capital projects fund, was reviewed.

Bob Jepsen moved, and Perry Spackman seconded, that the financial report be approved. Ayes: Wood, Godfrey, Pitcher, Jepsen, Price, Nelson, Johnson, Mather, Rigby, Smith, Spackman, Ricks, and Tingey. Nays: none. Motion passed unanimously.
